Councillor Duties

GSA Council meets once monthly September-April and at least twice May-August. Councillor terms run from September to August. Councillors are expected to regularly attend these meetings or find a proxy from their department should they be absent. In addition, councillors:

- Report to Council on activities and issues among their constituents;
- Report to their constituents on the activities of GSA Council;
- Serve on at least one GSA committee *and/or* volunteer for GSA and graduate student events over the fall and winter terms

Eligibility

All graduate students who are currently registered with the Faculty of Graduate and Post-doctoral Affairs are eligible to serve as a councillor. This includes part-time and graduate diploma students.

Please ensure that the departmental society you are representing completes and submits a (mandatory) <u>Departmental Society Registration</u> application, available at the GSA office.

Selection Process

For those candidates chosen by their departmental student society, this completed application form is required and must be submitted to the GSA (6th floor Unicentre) by the deadline.

For departments with fewer than 25 registered full-time graduate students (including MA & PhD), one councillor is allotted; for departments with greater than 25 registered full-time graduate students (including MA & PhD), two councillors are allotted.
