## f) Motion 13.04.2012 - 4: Motion to strike GSA Ad-Hoc Safe Space Policy Committee:

Moved: Elizabeth Whyte (President) Seconded: Emma Hazan (Social Work)

Whereas, the province of Ontario has recently (2009) amended its Occupational Health and Safety Act with Bill 168 thereby expanding the responsibilities of employers regarding workplace health and safety, and;

Whereas, GSA Carleton Inc. is responsible for several workplaces, including Mike's Place and the GSA offices on the 6th floor of the University Centre, and;

Whereas existing policies of GSA Carleton Inc., such as the Workplace Violence and Harassment Policy, and the Collective Agreement between GSA Carleton Inc. and CUPE 1281 address harassment, discrimination and other forms of abuse involving employees of GSA Carleton Inc., and;

Whereas, the GSA is also responsible for various events, meetings, and gatherings that occur on and off campus, such as Welcome Weeks, and;

Whereas, the values laid out in section 2.2 of the GSA Constitution commit the organization to working for a space free from prejudice, discrimination, exploitation or abuse on the basis of but not limited to sex, race, ethnicity, language, religion, sexual orientation, age, nationality, socio-economic status, political affiliation or belief, disability, or marital status, and;

Whereas, there are other systemic forms of discrimination, such as gender, that are not included in this list, and;

Whereas the GSA and GSA Carleton Inc. are independent bodies whose members are subject to harassment and violence policies of Carleton University, and;

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Whereas the GSA does not have a formal policy addressing conduct of elected executives and Councillors as well as members and volunteers, and;

Whereas, many of us have witnessed disturbing acts of prejudice and abuse, for example in the use of social media for bullying, amongst members of the Carleton community, and;

Whereas, dealing with the diverse manifestations of forms discrimination, prejudice, exploitation or abuse is a complex process, and;

Whereas, ensuring that consequences for violations of the legislations or values balance the responsibilities of our members with their rights requires a significant amount of research and may require consultation with lawyers and other experts in the field, and;

Whereas the Board of Directors of GSA Carleton Inc. has expressed its intention to review the relationship between the GSA and GSA Carleton Inc. and consider changes to governing documents with the assistance of legal counsel, therefore;

Be it resolved that, the GSA Council strike an Ad-Hoc Safe Space Committee to evaluate a possible policy to address this range of rights and responsibilities regarding safe space in all aspects of the GSA's work, and;

Be it further resolved that an Ad-Hoc Safe Space Committee be chaired by a GSA Executive member, and to include representation from a minimum of two Councillors, two GSA Executives, and one GSA full-time staff member, and;

Be it further resolved the Ad-Hoc Safe Space Committee seek input from CUPE 1281 and the Board of Directors of GSA Carleton Inc., if appropriate, and;

Be it further resolved that a draft policy be presented to Council for broader debate before September 2012.

# g) Motion 13.04.2012 - 5: Motion to Support Efforts to Organize Postdoctoral Scholars at Carleton University

Whereas Postdoctoral Scholars have completed their graduate studies, are often repaying student loans and have families to support, and;

Whereas Postdoctoral Scholars on average earn a low wage, receive few or no benefits, and generally are not protected from arbitrary discipline and dismissal, and;

Whereas most Postdoctoral Scholars seek faculty positions, and;

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Whereas many graduate students will pursue faculty positions and it is in graduate students' interest to ensure faculty positions are available in the future and that Carleton University continues to expand its research capacity, and;

Whereas it would be against graduate students' interest if Postdoctoral Scholars become the research equivalent of Contract Instructors, and;

Whereas members of the Carleton University Postdoctoral Association (CUPA) have initiated a drive to organize into a union to collectively bargain for better working conditions, and;

Whereas Postdoctoral Scholars who have organized at other Canadian universities have successfully negotiated for health benefits, protection from arbitrary discipline and dismissal, maternity leave, wage increases, and other improvements to working conditions, therefore;

Be it resolved that the Council of the Graduate Students' Association endorse Postdoctoral Scholars' efforts to unionize, and;

BIFRT the Council of the Graduate Students' Association encourage other campus organizations and their membership to support the organizing efforts of Postdoctoral Scholars at Carleton University.

 h) Motion 13.04.2012 – 6: (First Reading): Motion Against Rape Culture/Gender Based Violence Moved: Ron Couchman (Sociology and Anthropology)
 Seconded: Zahirul Alam (Electronics)

Whereas, section 2.2 of the current GSA constitution currently states:

The GSA shall promote and assist in maintaining an academic and social environment free from prejudice, discrimination, exploitation, or abuse on the basis of, but not limited to sex, race, ethnicity, language, religion, sexual orientation, age, nationality, socio-economic status, political affiliation or belief, disability, or marital status.

Whereas, there is often a needed to mention specifically, various forms of discrimination to give them systemic and institutional recognition, so that working to end them can come from an institutional level, and;

Whereas gender based violence and rape culture at Carleton has been recognized through the GSA through support for the Carleton Coalition for a Sexual Assault Support Center and other initiatives and statements, and;

Whereas, rape jokes serve as a means of exclusion and discrimination based on the experiences of gender based violence survivors on campus, and;

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Whereas, 25% of university aged women will experiences sexual assault during their 4 years at school (U of A statistics). Men and women and gender-queer folks experience violence. In addition, members of LGBTQ communities, First Nations communities, people living with a disability, particularly women with a cognitive disability, experiences gender based violence at a higher rate then the category "woman," and;

Whereas, the perpetuation of rape culture though marginalizing experiences, rape jokes, or humour is triggering to those who experience violence, and;

Whereas, discrimination based on gender identity places students at risk and hinders student's abilities to complete their studies, and;

Whereas; recent current events at the undergraduate level illustrate the dangers of not taking proactive action to support those facing discrimination and violence, therefore;

Be it resolved; GSA amend section 2.2 to include specific mention of gender based violence and rape culture such that it reads:

The GSA shall promote and assist in maintaining an academic and social environment free from prejudice, rape culture, discrimination, exploitation, or abuse on the basis of, but not limited to, sex, gender, race, ethnicity, language, religion, sexual orientation, age, nationality, socio-economic status, political affiliation or belief, disability, or marital status.

BIFRT Jokes depicting any of these forms of abuse or discrimination will be considered discrimination, and;

BIFRT any GSA council or executive member found to breach this policy will remove themselves or be excused from their position, in order to enforce safe(r) space policy.

Motion to delete the last two clauses and change "gender" in BIR to "gender identity" Moved by Ron Couchman (Sociology and Anthropology) Seconded by Tabatha Armstrong (Canadian Studies)

Be it resolved; GSA amend section 2.2 to include specific mention of gender based violence and rape culture such that it reads:

The GSA shall promote and assist in maintaining an academic and social environment free from prejudice, rape culture, discrimination, exploitation, or abuse on the basis of, but not limited to, sex, gender identity, race, ethnicity, language, religion, sexual orientation, age, nationality, socio-economic status, political affiliation or belief, disability, or marital status.

i) Motion 13.04.2012 - 7: (First Reading): Motion to Integrate Fighting Oppression as part of "Regular Business"

Seconded: M Zahirul Alam

Whereas section 5.1.5 of the constitution currently reads: The Executive shall be empowered by the council of the GSA (hereinafter to be referred to as Council) to act in the place of Council in dealing with routine business, and;

Whereas prejudice, rape culture, discrimination, exploitation, or abuse on the basis of but not limited to sex, gender, race, ethnicity, language, religion, sexual orientation, age, nationality, socio-economic status, political affiliation or belief, disability, or marital status are systemic and regularly occurring issues in society, including on Carleton's Campus, and;

Whereas reacting swiftly to oppose instances of oppression is important in illustrating to students, faculty, and staff that they have support from the Graduate Student Association and are not alone when facing issues of violence (whether physical or psychological), and;

Whereas; Regular business should be understood to include statements of support or any other forms of support for organizations or individuals who work to end or prevent gender based violence at Carleton. This should include but is not limited to sexist, racist, ablest comments etc, as well as speak out on behalf of the GSA against comments supporting rape culture, therefore;

Be it resolved; section 5.1.5 of the GSA constitution be amended to read:

The Executive shall be empowered by the council of the GSA (hereinafter to be referred to as Council) to act in the place of Council in dealing with routine business, including statements of support or other support for organizations or individuals who work to end violence and oppression as described in 2.2 of the constitution.

Receives two thirds required, will return to next council
